Abstract: George W. Truett served as long-time pastor of the First Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas, Texas Baptist leader, President of the Southern Baptist Convention and Baptist World Alliance. This microfiche collection includes addresses, articles, biographical information, books written by Truett, correspondence, sermons, prayers, photographs, poems, and information on First Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas.

Biographical Sketch:

George Washington Truett, born May 6, 1867, in Hayesville, North Carolina, the seventh child of Charles L. and Mary R. Kimsey Truett, was converted and joined Hayesville Baptist Church in 1886. He was the founder and principal of Hiwassee Academy, Towns County, Georgia, 1887 – 1889. His family moved to Whitewright, Grayson County, Texas, in 1889, where the Whitewright Baptist Church ordained him to the ministry in 1890. As financial secretary of Baylor University, Waco, Truett raised \$92,000 in 23 months, 1891 – 1893, to wipe out Baylor's indebtedness. He entered Baylor as a freshman in September, 1893, and graduated with the A.B. degree in June, 1897. Truett married Josephine Jenkins of Waco in 1894 and served as student-pastor of East Waco Baptist Church while at Baylor.

Truett became pastor of the First Baptist Church, Dallas, in September, 1897, and remained there until his death on July 7, 1944. During his 47-year pastorate, membership increased from 715 to 7,804 (a total of 19,531 new members were received) and total contributions were \$6,027,741.52. Truett was President of the Southern Baptist Convention, 1927 – 1929, and of the Baptist World Alliance, 1934 – 1939. In addition, Truett was a trustee of Baylor University, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, and Baylor Hospital, Dallas.

Constantly in demand for evangelistic, academic, and denominational sermons and addresses, Truett was preacher to the "Cowboy Camp Meetings" in west Texas for 37 summers, in addition to his pastorate. He preached to Allied Forces for six months in World War I, by appointment of President Woodrow Wilson, and he made an address on "Baptists and Religious Liberty" on the Capitol steps in Washington, D. C., May 16, 1920. He went on a preaching tour in South America during the summer of 1930, and he was the sole American speaker on the program of the Spurgeon

Centenary, London, England, in April, 1934. He also toured world mission fields as president of the Baptist World Alliance in 1935 – 1936.

After Truett's death, there were religious, educational, and healing institutional buildings erected or designated as memorials to him including: the seven-story educational building of First Baptist Church, Dallas; Truett Auditorium, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; Memorial Chapel, Dallas; three Truett Memorial churches in Denver, Colorado, Hayesville, North Carolina, and Los Angeles, California; Truett-McConnell Junior College, Cleveland, Georgia; Baptist Orphanage, Nazareth, Israel; and the Truett Building of Baylor Hospital, erected at a cost of \$5,500,000.

Scope and Content Note

This collection was given to the library at Southwestern Theological Seminary by the family of George W. Truett around 1953. The books and some other material were given earlier, shortly after Truett's death in 1944. The Memorandum of Agreement is located at the end of the contents list.

The collection includes addresses, articles, Baptist World Alliance files, biographical information, books written by Truett, extensive correspondence, travel files, diaries, material related to First Baptist Church, Dallas, lectures, maps, photographs, poems, prayers, and sermons. The collection documents Truett's influence as an evangelist, pastor, and denominational spokesman.

The staff of the Southwestern Seminary library prepared the following finding aid to the George Washington Truett Papers, located at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. The collection was placed in electronic format by the staff of the Southern Baptist Historical Library and Archives, and the SBHLA holds a microfiche copy of the papers on 336 fiche Microfiche #119.

Memorandum of Agreement

The family and heirs of the late Rev. George W. Truett of Dallas, Texas, and the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary of Fort Worth, Texas, agree that upon request of the former the latter shall receive from them and shall give care, custody, and protection to certain clippings, manuscripts, notebooks, papers, letters, scrapbooks, and other similar materials relating to the life, work, and ministry of the said Rev. George W. Truett.

The Seminary agrees to keep said materials within the premises of the Flemings Library building, now Roberts Library, to give to same security and protection, and to permit none but authorized persons to have access to or use of said materials. Only those persons shall be authorized whose moral character, Christian loyalty, scholarly competence, and sympathetic understanding of the late Dr. George W. Truett are above question.

Permission to use this collection for publication purposed by persons other than students and teachers of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary shall be referred to a joint committee composed of the president of the Seminary, one elected by the faculty of the School of Theology, and the librarian, who also shall serve as chairman, and three representatives of the family of Dr. George W. Truett. When requests come from students or teachers in the Seminary for the use of this material, the decision of the Seminary members of the joint committee shall be final. Mrs. George W. Truett and Dr. and Mrs. Powhatan W. James, Sr., shall be the first representatives of Dr. Truett’s family to serve on the above-mentioned joint committee. Persons designated by the family or heirs of the late George W. Truett may fill vacancies on the family part of the joint committee.

It is agreed by both parties that all use of this material shall be within the Fleming Library building, now Roberts Library, and that none of this material shall ever be permitted to go outside of said library building except upon special permission of the representatives of the family and heirs of the late Rev. George W. Truett.

Either party may terminate this agreement upon reasonable request.
