### Summary

Main Entry: Alldredge, Eugene Perry Papers

Date Span: 1919 – 1948

Abstract: The collection is primarily correspondence and documents related to the beginning and growth of the Department of Surveys, Statistics, and Information at the Sunday School Board. Subjects covered in the collection include: 75 Million Campaign, use of American Standard Version in Sunday School lesson material, American Baptist Seminary, Ridgecrest Baptist Assembly, and considerable information on Baptist statistics and Baptist associations.

### Historical Sketch

Dr. Lansing Burrows was Southern Baptists' statistician, from 1881 to 1919, and recording secretary for the SBC, from 1881 – 1913, while being a pastor to many large churches. Working long hours, late into the night, he must have felt that his task was thankless and too exacting. He came to see that an agency of the Convention should take over the statistical work for the denomination. In 1918, the SBC instructed the Sunday School Board to establish a department that would take over this work. Thus began the Department of Survey, Statistics, and Information.

Dr. Hight C. Moore, who was then editorial secretary of the Sunday School Board and recording secretary of the SBC, went to Americus, Georgia, in 1919, after Dr. Burrows death, to gather and send all of Burrows statistical materials to the Sunday School Board. Dr. Moore was asked to oversee the statistical work until a full-time individual could be employed.

On September 14, 1920, Dr. E. P. Alldredge began work with the Sunday School Board as the first secretary of the newly-created Department of Survey, Statistics, and Information. Alldredge was also book editor for the Sunday School Board until Dr. John L. Hill came to work June 1, 1922.

### Biographical Sketch

Eugene Perry Alldredge was born May 30, 1875, in Brooksville, Alabama, the son of P. G. Alldredge (M.D.) and Emma Vicie (South) Alldredge. He was ordained to the Baptist ministry in 1899 and was pastor of Baptist churches in Kosse, Groesbeck, and Mexia, Texas, 1899 – 1904. He attended Baylor University in Waco, Texas, receiving the B. A. degree in 1900, an M. A. in 1901, and the Th.B. in 1903. He received the Th.M. in 1904 from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky.

Alldredge married Barbara M. Taliaferro Oct. 4, 1904, and the couple had two children, Eugene Perry and Mary. Barbara died Feb. 20, 1936.

Allredge was pastor of First Baptist Church in Amarillo, Texas, and Ervay St. Baptist Church in Dallas, until 1911, when he became state secretary of missions for the Baptist Convention of New Mexico. He was also editor of the Baptist New Mexico. He was pastor of Immanuel Baptist Church in Little Rock, Arkansas, from 1913 – 1919, and he also served as a member of the constitutional convention of Arkansas, the only minister in the group. He received the D.D. from Ouachita Baptist College in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, in 1917.

Dr. Allredge served as executive secretary for the Arkansas Baptist State Convention from 1919 until 1920, when he received the D.D. from Baylor University. He moved to Nashville, Tennessee and became the first secretary of the Department of Survey, Statistics, and Information of the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, serving from 1920 – 1945. Allredge was a member of Belmont Heights Baptist Church and preached at many Baptist churches in the area, including Lockeland, Belmont Heights, Eastland, Gallatin, and Franklin. He was also secretary of the American Baptist Seminary Commission in Nashville, from 1934 – 1949.

Dr. Allredge married Mrs. Elkin Lightfoot Lockett, Nov. 27, 1940, and retired from active duties with the Baptist Sunday School Board Sept. 15, 1945. He died in Nashville, Tennessee, Feb. 22, 1953, and was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection contains some of E. P. Allredge's papers, mostly correspondence, which show the beginning and growth of the first years of the work of the Department of Survey, Statistics, and Information of the Sunday School Board. Important parts of the collection deal with associational minutes, the publishing of the first handbook for Southern Baptists in 1921, and the town and city church survey. The Allredge papers include some personal as well as general correspondence.

The collection includes letters from many Southern Baptist leaders of state work, Board secretaries, pastors, editors of state papers, and heads of Baptist institutions. The correspondence is filed alphabetically by the individual corresponding with Allredge. Some of the subjects referred to are: associational minutes, Baptist World Alliance, editorial work for Sunday School Board, work of the International Sunday School lesson committee, interpretation of Scripture to answer doctrinal questions, Lansing Burrows' statistical materials, L. P. Leavell's illness, Russian bilingual quarterlies, Southern Baptist Convention secretary's work (including work with SBC annuals), 75 million campaign, Southern Baptist handbooks, B. W. Spilman's illness, statistical work, research questions and general discussion of events in Southern Baptist life.

The collection includes a notebook of sermons and lecture notes, 1896-1898. His lecture notes cover addresses by George W. Truett and other Baptist preachers and teachers.

The Allredge papers include some personal correspondence, but most of the material is related to his statistical work for Southern Baptists, speaking engagements, Scripture interpretations, his writings, and his collection of items such as books, yearbooks, state convention annuals, and associational minutes and other items dealing with Baptist history. This material dates from 1919 – 1929.
