Summary

Main Entry: Jerry Elmer Lambdin Collection

Date Span: 1914 – 1973

Abstract: The collection is a series of the Baptist Sunday School Board Records and includes correspondence, training union lessons, convention programs, and speeches. There are audio recordings, photographs, scrapbooks, and museum artifacts. Four boxes include material belonging to Lambdin's wife, Ina.

Biographical Note

Jerry Elmer Lambdin (1889 – 1960) served the Southern Baptist denomination for many years as the Sunday School Board's Baptist Young People's Union secretary. This department, later renamed the Training Union Department, wrote lessons for Southern Baptist Sunday Schools and trained those who taught Sunday School classes. Born December 4, 1889, Jerry Elmer Lambdin was one of fourteen children (Jim, John, Orville, Clay, Joseph, Jack, Lula, Mattie, Lillie, Mae, Lucy, Sarah, Mary) born to William Dempsey and Tennessee Delilah Satterfield Lambdin in Rutledge, Tennessee.

Lambdin attended Madison Academy in Rutledge, from 1893 – 1901, and, in 1908, the family moved to Knoxville, Tennessee, where he graduated from Knoxville City High School in 1913. During his high school years, Jerry Lambdin served as president of the Knox County Federation of the Baptist Young People's Union. Later, while a student at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Lambdin served as president of the Tennessee State Convention Baptist Young People's Union. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1917, and, later that same year, he moved to Montgomery, Alabama and served as the first state Baptist Young People's Union secretary until 1925.

The First World War interrupted Mr. Lambdin's duties as Union secretary in 1918 when he enlisted and served in a field artillery unit in Europe. He returned from Europe in 1919 and married Ina Smith of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, on December 17 of that year. In 1921, Lambdin completed some graduate work at Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky and attended Columbia University in New York City for a short time in 1924.

In 1925, Jerry Lambdin took a position at the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention in Nashville, Tennessee, as an associate of Landrum Pinson Leavell,

then secretary of the Baptist Young People's Union. Upon Landrum Leavell's death in 1929, Jerry Lambdin became secretary of the Baptist Young People's Union, a position he kept until his death. During his tenure at the Sunday School Board, Mr. Lambdin's wife, Ina, worked beside him daily as editor of Junior and Intermediate lessons, periodicals, and promotional materials.

In 1944, Lambdin completed more graduate work at George Peabody College in Nashville, and, in 1947, Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee conferred upon Lambdin an honorary Doctor of Literature degree. Affectionately known as "Mr. Training Union," Jerry Lambdin retired December 31, 1959. Less than a month later, January 24, 1960, Mr. Lambdin suffered a stroke while teaching his Sunday School class at First Baptist Church in Nashville and died later that day. Ina Lambdin continued her work as editor with the Training Union department until her death in 1975. Scope and Content Note

The Jerry Elmer Lambdin Collection, a series of the Baptist Sunday School Board Records, consists of twelve linear feet of material contained in twenty-five boxes. The collection contains information related to Jerry Lambdin's work as secretary of the Training Union department. The collection is arranged alphabetically by subject, the bulk of which is correspondence (including three bound volumes from his retirement), as well as materials related to the Baptist Training Union, such as lessons, convention programs, and speeches. Four boxes of material in the collection belonged to Ina Lambdin, most related to her book *Then Came Spring*. Also included in the collection are audio recordings of several of Jerry Lambdin's retirement functions and his funeral. There are photographs from tours of Europe and the United States, scrapbooks, and museum artifacts such as commemorative gavels from several conventions, Jerry Lambdin's academic regalia, and small figurines of Christ, the Disciples, and Judas Iscariot.
