Main Entry: Edwin Charles Dargan Papers

Date Span: 1873 – 1922

Abstract: Edwin Charles Dargan was a Southern Baptist minister, seminary professor, denominational leader, writer, and served as president of the Southern Baptist Convention. His collection consists of correspondence, lectures, addresses, and sermons. The correspondence includes denominational activities, family information, and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Numerous sermons focus on theological and moral issues and some on social concerns.

Biographical Sketch

- 1852, Nov. 17 Born in Darlington County, South Carolina, the son of John Orr Beasley (D.D.) and Jane Frances (Lide) Dargan, Edwin Charles Dargan was a minister, teacher, editor, and author. His father, a friend of James A. Furman, was a Baptist minister, as was his grandfather, Timothy Dargan. The Dargans were originally from Ireland.
- 1873 Dargan received an M. A. from Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina.
- 1877 He graduated from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.
- 1877 – 81 Dargan was pastor of churches in Bottetourt (Hollins), Big Lick (Roanoke), and Bonsack, Virginia, in Roanoke County, west of Lynchburg.
- 1878, June 12 He married Lucy A. Graves. Their children were Edwin Preston, John Herbert, Ethel Forrester, who died 1901, Mary Lydia, and Henry McCune.
- 1881 – 87 Dargan was pastor of First Baptist Church in Petersburg, Virginia,
- 1887 – 88 pastor in Dixon, California, and
- 1888 – 92 pastor of Citadel Square Baptist Church in Charleston, South Carolina.
- 1888 He taught at D. D. Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia.
- 1892 – 94 He was pastor of Glenn's Creek Church, Woodford County, Kentucky.
- 1892 – 1907 Dargan was professor of homiletics at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky.
- 1893, June 4 He preached the commencement sermon for Mercer University in Macon, Georgia.
- 1904 He Received the LL.D from Baylor University, Waco, Texas
- June 1907 –
- August 1917 Dargan was pastor of First Baptist Church, Macon, Georgia,
- 1911 – 1913 President of the Southern Baptist Convention, and
- 1917, July 31 –
- 1927, July 31 Editorial secretary of the Sunday School Board of the SBC.

1918 – 28 Dargan was a member of the International Sunday School Lesson Committee and
 1920 – 21 Chairman of International S. S. Lesson Committee.
 1920 He received the Litt. D. from Furman University in Greenville, S. C.
 1930, Oct. 26 Dargan died in Chicago, Illinois

Scope and Content Note

The Dargan Papers are divided into four series:

A. Correspondence

B. Family Correspondence

C. Sermons and Addresses

D. Subject files.

Dargan's work-related correspondence is arranged in alphabetical order by folder title. The letters include his service as a pastor, writer, and editor for the Sunday School Board, in addition to his tenure as President of the Southern Baptist Convention from 1911 to 1913. The family letters are filed in a general chronological order.

Unnumbered sermons are arranged alphabetically by sermon title or Scripture text. Included are two series of numbered sermons, one from the 1870's and the other from the mid- 1880's. The first series is mostly untitled sermons. The second series is titled, usually by scripture passage. Numbered sermons follow their numerical sequence. When available, the folder listing shows the title of the sermon and the year it was first preached. Most of the Dargan sermons list when and where the sermon was preached. Some sermons do not include a title or subject and are arranged by Dargan's assigned number and identified as "Sermons- Untitled."

Some of the subjects in the correspondence files include alien immersion, biographical information, family correspondence, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and the Whitsitt Controversy. In addition to the correspondence and sermons are lecture notes, clippings, and various subject files. Most of the sermons in the collection focus on theological and moral topics, but some unusual topics are included. At least two sermons deal with the relationship of labor and capital, and two sermons are entitled, "The moral responsibility of the press" and "A call to railroad men."

The papers cover the years 1873 to 1922 and include 6 linear feet of material.

The family correspondence is extensive and outstanding. In the 1901 – 1904 letters, Dr. Dargan's son, Preston, wrote of his schooling and travels and also of his sister Ethel's illness.

Many invitations to preach and speak are among the papers. Dargan was invited to be pastor of several churches and president of Furman University, Greenville, South Carolina, and Baptist Female University in Raleigh, North Carolina. See letter from John White, 1900.
