

Summary

Main Entry: Southern Baptist Convention. Mason Study Collection

Date Span: 1992 – 1993

Abstract: Collection includes correspondence, articles, pamphlets and books related to the Southern Baptist Convention's study of Freemasonry. The study focused on Freemasonry's compatibility with the Southern Baptist faith and the acceptability of members of Baptist churches to be Masons.

Historical Sketch

At 1992 annual session of the Southern Baptist Convention, James L. Holly proposed a resolution recommending a study of Freemasonry. Holly believed that the principles and rituals of Freemasonry made it incompatible with the Southern Baptist faith. The messengers of the convention approved an amended version of the resolution, which directed the Interfaith Witness Department of the Home Mission Board to "study the compatibility with Christianity and Southern Baptist doctrine of the organization known variously as the Masonic Lodge, Masonry, Freemasonry, and or Ancient and Accepted Right of Freemasonry."

In addition to consulting numerous articles, books and publications regarding Freemasonry, the Interfaith Witness Department received hundreds of letters from Masons from across the country and across numerous faiths. At the conclusion of the study, the Interfaith Witness Department concluded that membership in Masonic Lodges should be an individual choice, in concurrence with Baptist principles.

Scope and Content Note

The Mason Study Collection (3 linear ft.) consists of correspondence, articles, pamphlets and books related to the study of Freemasonry conducted by the Southern Baptist Convention from 1992 – 1993.

The major topics and issues included in the papers are: Freemasonry, its relation and compatibility to the Southern Baptist faith, religious liberty, and masonry's compatibility

to other Christian faiths.
