Summary

Main Entry: Everett Gill Collection

Date Span: 1878 – 1960

Abstract: Everett Gill was a Southern Baptist pastor and the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board representative for Europe from 1921 to 1939. His son, Everett, Gill, Jr., served as a Southern Baptist pastor and as the secretary for Latin America for the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board from 1942 to 1954. The collection contains biographical data and documents related to father and son, family correspondence, non-family correspondence, sermons, addresses, scrapbooks, and writings.

Biographical Note

Southern Baptist Convention Foreign Mission Board representative to Europe, and pastor, Everett Gill, Sr., was born November 4, 1869, in Huntsville, Missouri. Gill was educated at William Jewell College (A.B., 1890) and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (Th.M., 1894; Th.D., 1895). He received the Doctor of Divinity degree from Georgetown College in 1910 and from William Jewell College in 1937.

Everett Gill, Sr. served as pastor to churches in Kentucky and Missouri prior to his service with the Foreign Mission Board in Europe. During World War I, he was a member of the American Relief Administration in Russia. From 1921 – 1939, Everett Gill, Sr. was the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board representative for Europe. Under his guidance, two new Baptist seminaries were organized in Europe. Beginning in 1939, he served the Wake Forest Baptist Church as pastor for one year. Gill died February 5, 1958.

Everett Gill, Sr. married Emma G. Williams October 10, 1895. They had five children: Harrison Williams, Charles Fairchild, Everett, Jr., Geraldine, and Mary Elizabeth.

Everett Gill, Sr. authored *La Scuola della Chiesa* (1931), *Iglesias del Nuevo Testamento* (n.d.), *Europe and the Gospel* (1931), *Europe: Christ or Chaos* (1937), and *A.T. Robertson: A Biography* (1943).

Following in his father's footsteps with a heart for missions, Everett Gill, Jr. served as Foreign Mission Board secretary for Latin America and also as a pastor. He was born July 31, 1901 in Hannibal, Missouri. Gill was educated at the Deutsche Schule in Rome, U.S. Hall's Westpoint –

Annapolis Coaching School, William Jewell College, U.S. Naval Academy (1919 – 1921), and the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He received a Ph.D. from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from William Jewell College.

In 1923, Everett Gill, Jr. was ordained by Calvary Baptist Church, Kansas City, Missouri. At Rock Port, Missouri, Crab Orchard, and Junction City, Kentucky, he served as a student pastor. From 1927 – 1934, he was pastor of the First Baptist Church, Marshall, Missouri. From 1934 – 1941, he served as pastor of St. Charles Avenue Baptist Church, New Orleans, Louisiana. January 1, 1942, the Foreign Mission Board selected Everett Gill, Jr. as secretary for Latin America, where he served until his death April 25, 1954.

Everett Gill, Jr. married Rachel Truex, the daughter of Dr. H.E. Truex. They had three children: Elizabeth Perry, Everett, III, and Jane Rachel.

He authored *Pilgrimage to Spanish America* (1951) and *Pilgrimage to Brazil* (1954).

Scope and Content Note

The Everett Gill Collection contains 7 linear feet of material in 13 boxes. The collection contains material that spans the years 1878 to 1960. The material documents the mission work of Everett Gill, Sr., Southern Baptist representative for Europe, and Everett Gill, Jr., Southern Baptist secretary for Latin America. The collection includes correspondence, family correspondence, missions, photographs, publications, scrapbooks, sermons and addresses, and writings.

Two types of correspondence are included in the papers. The non-family correspondence includes letters from A.T. Robertson, Ella Robertson, Herschel H. Hobbs, W.O. Carver, Roland Q. Leavell, the Macmillan Company, Charles E. Maddry, Hight C. Moore, E.Y. Mullins, E.C. Routh, John R. Sampey, and L.R. Scarborough, in addition to Everett Gill, Sr.'s biography of A.T. Robertson. There is a significant amount of family correspondence between Everett Gill, Sr. and Everett Gill, Jr., along with considerable family correspondence between Everett Gill, Jr., and his wife, Rachel. The family correspondence contains loving messages, family details, and mission information.

Files on missions comprise material on Argentina, Brazil, China, Italy, Mexico, and Uruguay. The scrapbooks and photographs are mostly of Latin America. Bogomile tombs and the Sea of Galilee are included in the photographs. There are two panoramic photographs: the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary graduating class of 1925 and the 1919 – 1920 Regiment of Midshipmen.

The sermons and addresses are mostly by Everett Gill, Sr. While they cover a wide range of topics, there are a number of sermons and addresses that cover the European situation from World War I to World War II. Writings, such as *Doctor Bob*, *Leaves in the Wind*, *Protestants of the East*, and *First Century Home and Foreign Missions*, include a significant amount of information on Europe during this period.

The collection is arranged alphabetically by folder title. It was received in 2004 from the International Mission Board Archives. Additional correspondence (22 folders) of Everett Gill, Sr. is located in the Missionary Correspondence Files of the Foreign Mission Board in the Southern Baptist Historical Library and Archives (AR 551 – 2).
