Main Entry: Southern Baptist Convention. Home Mission Board. Language Missions Collection

Date Span: 1950 – 1989

Abstract: The Language Missions Division of the Home Mission Board (North American Mission Board) helped language mission efforts in the United States by incorporating a variety of ethnicities into the Southern Baptist Convention through materials and programs. The collection contains articles, bulletins, correspondence, pamphlets, pictures, and subject files, with three series based on the tenure of each director.

Historical Note

The Language Missions Division of the Home Mission Board (now called the North American Mission Board) was created in the 1950s to further language mission efforts in the United States. Since the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, the Board worked with various ethnic groups as immigration and urban populations increased. The changes in the cultural make-up of the American population presented a challenge to produce materials and programs that would incorporate a variety of ethnicities into the Southern Baptist Convention. Another objective of the Division was to encourage Southern Baptist leaders and members to think about ethnic groups as part of their growth plan and leadership responsibilities.

Throughout the twentieth century, the Division expanded its missions activities to include deaf missions, ethnic fellowship advocacy, ethnic leadership development, ethnic youth ministries, ethno cultural church starting, ethno linguistic church starting, immigration ministries, international seafarers' ministries, refugee, and resettlement ministries. Ethnic groups served by the Division included Cambodian, Chinese, Filipino, Hispanic, Japanese, Korean, Laotian, Native American and Vietnamese.

Lloyd Corder served as the first Secretary of Language Missions from 1950 – 1965 and later become Associate Director, Missions Division, of the Home Mission Board. His successor, Gerald Palmer, was Secretary from 1966 – 1970, who later became Eastern Regional Coordinator for the Home Mission Board. Oscar I. Romo was the director of the Language Missions Division from 1971 until 1989 and oversaw the creation of the Language Church

Extension Division that replaced the Language Missions Division in 1989. During Mr. Romo's tenure, the division produced *America's Ethnicity of the Eighties*, with multiple revised editions that compiled census data on American ethnic groups and reports about missions activities with them.¹ Russell Begaye succeeded Mr. Romo, as director of the Language Church Extension Division, and published *Ethnograph: Ethnic Southern Baptists at Work* in 1997 that added information regarding American ethnic groups in the 1990s.

Scope and Content Note

The Language Mission Division Collection contains 16 linear feet of material in 16 record boxes. Records span from 1919 to 1989, with the majority of records from 1940 until 1970. Included are records from Loyd Corder, Gerald B. Palmer, and Oscar I. Romo. The collection includes articles, bulletins, correspondence, pamphlets, pictures, and subject files.

Language groups represented in the collection include Chinese, Deaf, French, Japanese, Russian, Spanish, and Vietnamese. Also part of the collection is correspondence from prominent Baptist leaders such as Noble Beall, E. J. Combs, S. F. Dowis, Christine Garnett, Victor Glass, Joshua Grijalva, Milton S. Leach, Jr., Roland A. Leavell, C. E. Matthews, Albert McClellan, and L. D. Wood.

Correspondence from Corder's tenure contains information about his work in Spanish missions, with much of the correspondence concerning missions in the Southwest, Cuba, Panama, and Puerto Rico. Records from Gerald B. Palmer are primarily writings about language missions and broader missions programs that Mr. Palmer worked on after his promotion to Director of the Missions Section, Home Mission Board. Extensive files related to Southern Baptist mission ventures in Canada and Puerto Rico are documented in the Palmer material. Oscar I. Romo's files have several histories about mission efforts among American ethnic groups.
