Summary

Main Entry: The McCready-Orr Collection

Date Span: 1800 – 2005

Abstract: *John Dudley McCready's* life showed a deep passion for learning, teaching, preaching, and writing. From 1926 to 1939, he served three Alabama churches – Decatur, Demopolis, and Prairieville. From 1939 to 1956, he served the First Baptist Church in Morganton, NC. From 1944 – 1946, the Morganton Baptist Church granted him a leave of absence to serve as a Baptist chaplain in World War II. From 1956 to 1966, he was professor of English and the humanities at Chowan College and then the Central Florida Junior College. The papers and files of John Dudley McCready include both professional and personal material. Professional papers include correspondence, photographs, original writings and publications, church records, and sermons. JDM's wife, *Mary Winston (Martin) McCready*, was a life-long member of the Baptist church and devoted minister's wife and mother. Her papers are mostly personal, including correspondence, photographs, and records related to her family, current church, and the Mary Winston Baptist Church, an African-American church named in her honor. Mary Winston's devoted sister, *Fannie Cullom (Martin) Orr*, was a life-long lay woman in the Baptist Church. Her main work was recording and discovering her Alabama family roots. Her papers are mainly personal with correspondence, photographs, membership records of patriotic organizations, and genealogy research.

Biographical Sketch

The Rev. John Dudley McCready was born June 26, 1894 in Winchester KY. He was one of eight children of Rev. William George McCready (an Episcopal clergyman) and Margaret Anne (French) McCready, whose family had early Baptist Church ties in Clark County, KY. He attended Columbia University and Union Theological Seminary in New York and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky. Indecisive about whether to teach or preach, he began teaching at Howard College in Birmingham, Alabama, followed by joining the staff at Southside Baptist Church in Birmingham where he was ordained in 1927. There he met his future wife, Mary Winston Martin. From 1929 – 1939, he served the First Baptist Church in Demopolis, AL and Prairieville Baptist Church. In 1939, he became pastor of the First Baptist Church in Morganton, NC, and, during that tenure, was granted a leave of absence in 1944 to serve in the U. S. Chaplaincy Corps during World War II. Resigning from the Morganton Church in 1956, he taught English at Chowan College in Murfreesboro, NC and Central Florida Junior College in Ocala, FL until 1966. Throughout his adult life, he wrote short stories and commentaries which were published in ten newspapers mainly in North Carolina and Virginia. For many years, John Dudley, his wife Mary Winston, and their daughter had a home in Black Mountain, NC near the Baptist Assembly at Ridgecrest. It served as a place of retreat, and they were there when he died in 1973.

Mary Winston (Martin) McCready was born in Russellville, Alabama October 28, 1900. Always a devout young person, she made her profession of faith at age 12 and was baptized. She was an active member at the Southside Baptist Church where she met and married John Dudley McCready. Not unacquainted with sadness, their first child, a son, lived only one week. Their daughter, Mary Winston McCready, was a handicapped child with Down's syndrome. She was given every advantage and surrounded by great affection her entire life. Mary was a gracious, supportive minister's wife and friend to many. On her grandparents' farm near Emelle, Alabama, the Mary Winston McCready Baptist Church was established which served the African American population of the area. Following her husband's death, she and her daughter lived in Ocala, Florida where she was made Mother of the Year in 2001. Her daughter, Mary Winston, died in 2000, and she died on Christmas day in 2005 at the age of 105.

Fannie Cullom (Martin) Orr was born in Emelle, Alabama May 18, 1907. Devoted to her family and discovering the roots of many family branches, Fanny was an avid genealogist and loyal member of several patriotic organizations for women. She was greatly influenced by her Aunt Fanny Cullom Quigley, for whom she was named. Her other interests included a home decorating business and church missions, including a Haitian hospital. Her husband, Daniel Johnson Orr, served in the U. S. Navy and was employed by the Commerce Clearing House in Chicago, IL.

Scope and Content Note

The collection includes 17 linear feet of material dating from 1800 – 2005, with the bulk of the material dating 1900 to 2005. The collection is essentially the papers of John Dudley McCready, his wife Mary Winston (Martin) McCready, and her sister, Fannie Cullom (Martin) Orr. Included is information about Rev. McCready's family, education, World War II service as chaplain, his pastorates, and teaching positions. His years at First Baptist Church in Morganton, NC, including his chaplaincy service, are among the most valuable portions. His love for writing and story-telling are shown in his sermons, newspaper columns, and books. A second section relates to Mrs. McCready's family background, education, marriage and love of her children, and community involvement as a minister's wife. The Mary Winston Baptist Church material includes African-American history and photographs of a small, but vital, congregation in Emelle, AL. The third section reveals Fannie M. Orr genealogical search of family roots through the branches of Cullom, Martin, Mitchell, and Winston. Included are extensive correspondence, photographs, and other varied records. Decades of her work are revealed in this collection.
