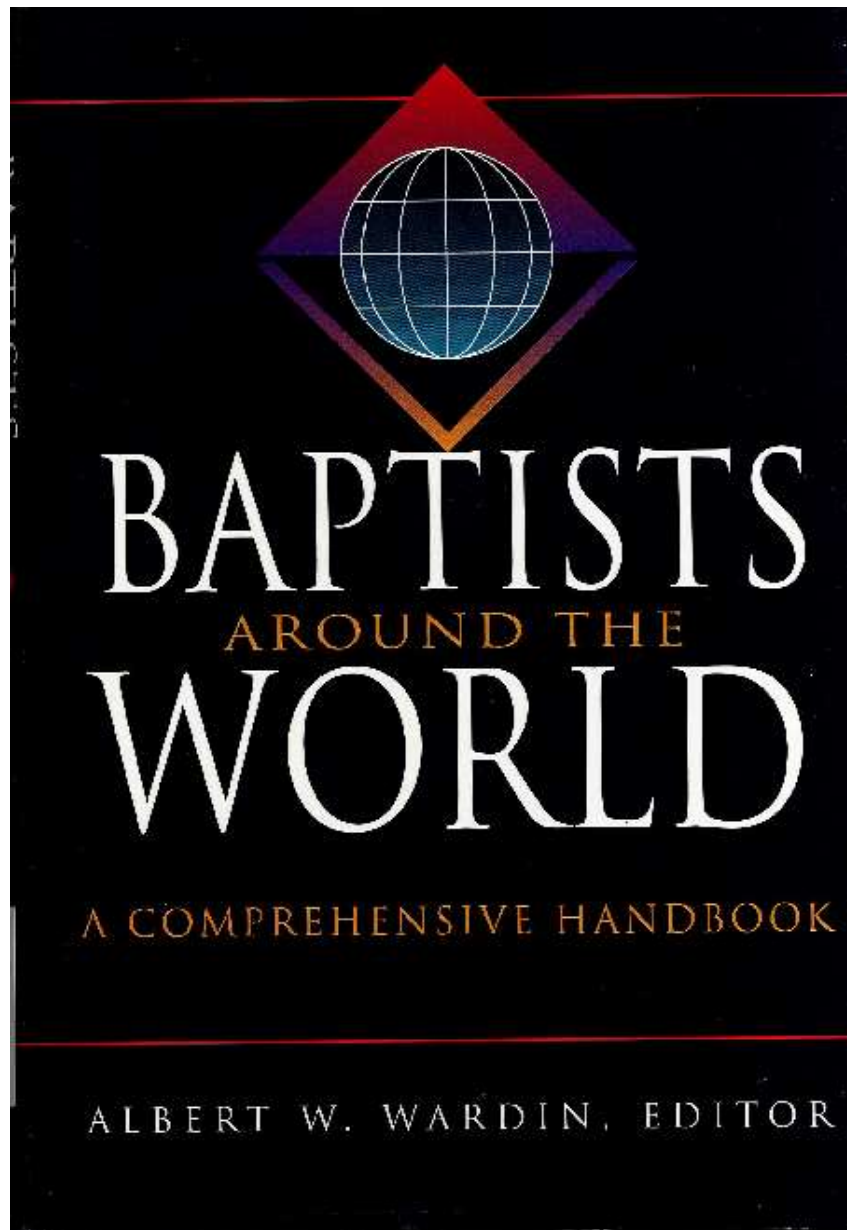

Summary

Main Entry: Albert Wardin Baptists Around the World Collection

Date Span: 1820 – 2021

Abstract: Collection of material and information on Baptist groups, conventions, and associations around the world. The material documents the history and work of Baptists in numerous countries and especially in the United States. Much of the material was collection for Dr. Wardin's book *Baptists Around the World* published by Broadman Press in 1995. The collection includes Wardin's notes on the location of additional information, copies of articles, copies of sections of books, clippings, pamphlets, brochures, maps, statistical data, biographical information on Baptists, information on Wardin's visits to Baptists outside the United States, references to source material in Baptist archives, and correspondence with other Baptists across the world. The collection is divided into two series. The vast majority of material is located in the Country Files. These files focus on Baptist activity in countries and regions around the world. A second and small series includes general files and information on the publication of the book, *Baptists Around the World*. Almost half of the collection is related to Baptists in America.

Biographical Sketch

Albert W. Wardin, Jr. was born March 11, 1928, the first child of Anna and Albert Wardin of Portland, Oregon. He grew up on the family dairy farm in the Portland area. He received his B.A. degree from Willamette University in Salem, Oregon, in 1946, and, a year later, he received his M.A. in history from Stanford. After Stanford, Wardin went to Western Seminary in Portland, where he got the bachelor of divinity degree. He completed his Ph.D. in history at the University of Oregon, writing his dissertation on Baptists in Oregon.

Wardin taught at Western Seminary in Portland for a total of eight years. In 1967, he began a long career as history professor at Belmont University in Nashville, Tennessee. Wardin retired from teaching at Belmont University in 1993, but he continued his research and writing, including work on Baptists in Russia and Eastern Europe and Baptists everywhere. During his distinguished career, he published at least twelve books and numerous articles on Baptists, many related to Baptists in Russia and Eastern Europe. Wardin died on November 14, 2022, at the age of 94, in Nashville, Tennessee. A short list of those publications follows:

Scope and Content Note

The collection of material includes a wide range of material collected by Wardin on Baptists all over the world. Much of the material was used for his 1995 volume, *Baptists Around the World*, published by Broadman Press. Wardin continued to collect material related to Baptists, hopeful of an updated version of his book. The collection includes Wardin's notes on the location of additional information, copies of articles, copies of sections of books, clippings, pamphlets, brochures, maps, statistical data, biographical information, information on Wardin's visits to Baptists outside the United State, references to source material in Baptist archives and correspondence with other Baptists across the world. Almost half of the collection is related to Baptists in America.

Folder titles were determined by Wardin's designation with some adjustment by the archives staff. Dates are included on some folders when indicated by Wardin. Most of the correspondence files are dated but many of the other files are not dated.

The collection is divided into two series. The vast majority of material is located in the Country Files. These files focus on Baptist activity in countries and regions around the world. A second and small series includes general files and information on the publication of the book, *Baptists Around the World*.

Wardin donated the material to the Southern Baptist Historical Library and Archives in 2012 and 2013 and assisted the staff in the organization and identification of material in the collection.
